Have fun, stay safe and enjoy the festivities!

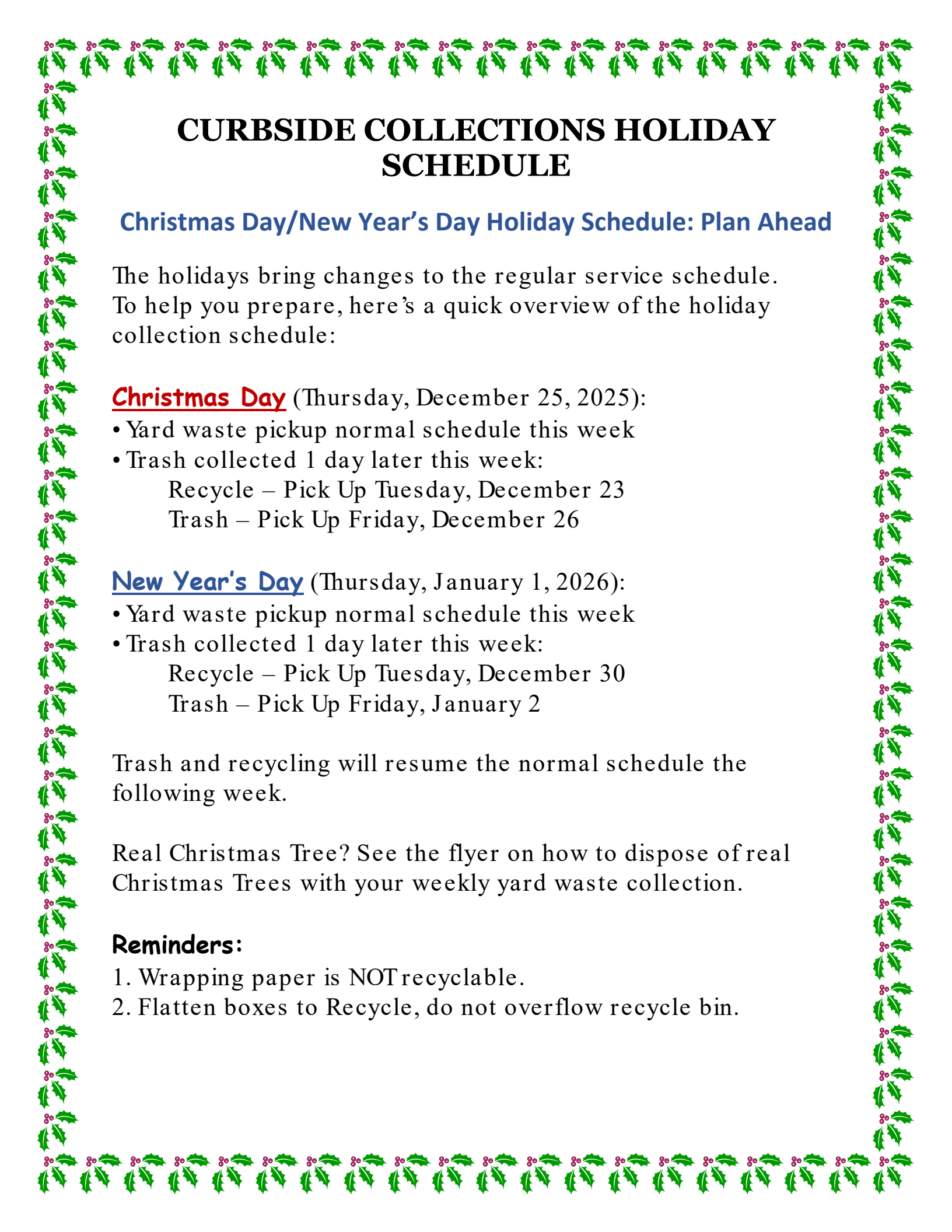

CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Christmas Day/New Year's Day Holiday Schedule: Plan Ahead

The holidays bring changes to the regular service schedule. To help you prepare, here's a quick overview of the holiday collection schedule:

Christmas Day (Thursday, December 25, 2025):

- Yard waste pickup normal schedule this week
- Trash collected 1 day later this week:
 - Recycle – Pick Up Tuesday, December 23
 - Trash – Pick Up Friday, December 26

New Year's Day (Thursday, January 1, 2026):

- Yard waste pickup normal schedule this week
- Trash collected 1 day later this week:
 - Recycle – Pick Up Tuesday, December 30
 - Trash – Pick Up Friday, January 2

Trash and recycling will resume the normal schedule the following week.

Real Christmas Tree? See the flyer on how to dispose of real Christmas Trees with your weekly yard waste collection.

Reminders:

1. Wrapping paper is NOT recyclable.
2. Flatten boxes to Recycle, do not overflow recycle bin.



Christmas Tree Collection

- Remove all lights and decorations
- Leave your tree curbside for **Yard Waste**



Yard Waste is picked up every ***Monday*** by the Town of Rising Sun, unless it is a holiday, then it moves to the next day.

*Note: The Martin Luther King, Jr. Day holiday is on Monday January 19th, 2026, and yard waste pick up will move to Tuesday, January 20th, 2026.

SNOW REMOVAL CODE for THE TOWN OF RISING SUN

As beautiful as it is, SNOW brings with it some responsibilities that need to be revisited.

Section 302.15 of the Town's Property Maintenance & Minimum Housing Code
requires the following:

302.15. Snow, ice, objects and storm debris removal from sidewalks. All owners of buildings or land shall be responsible for the removal of any snow, ice, objects and storm debris as follows:

- A. The owner of any property that abuts any sidewalks on a public highway or common alley shall remove all storm debris as defined in chapter 2, and any snow from such sidewalks, within the time periods stipulated below:
 - 1 Twelve (12") inches of snow or less - twenty-four (24) hours after the final snowfall as established by the Town.
 - 2 Snow greater than twelve (12") inches and up to eighteen (18") inches – forty-eight (48) hours after the final snowfall as established by the Town.
 - 3 Snow Greater than eighteen (18") inches and up to twenty-four (24") inches – seventy-two (72) hours after the final snowfall as established by the Town.
 - 4 Snow Greater than twenty-four (24") inches and up to thirty-six (36") inches – ninety-six (96) hours after the final snowfall as established by the Town.
 - 5 Snow Greater than thirty-six (36") inches – time limit as established by, and posted by the Town of Rising Sun.
- C. The owner of any property that abuts any sidewalks on a public highway or common alley shall not permit ice, upon which it is dangerous to travel, to remain on such sidewalk. If the snow and ice is frozen so hard that it cannot be removed without injury to the pavement or damaging the base of the footpath, the owner shall apply adequate ashes, sand sawdust or any suitable abrasive material for added footing for pedestrians' usage and soon thereafter as the weather permits shall thoroughly clean such sidewalks of compacted snow or ice.
- D. No owner shall permit snow, ice, objects or storm debris to conceal any fire hydrant, or other fire department connections located on their property and shall be responsible for the removal of any snow, ice, objects or storm debris as part of subsection A above.
- E. No owner shall permit snow, ice, objects or storm debris to remain on any fire department access road located on their property and shall be responsible for the removal of any snow, ice, objects or storm debris as part of subsection A above.
- F. Snow, ice, objects or storm debris removed from sidewalk areas shall be placed on the property of the owner adjacent to the removal area. Excessive amounts of snow, or ice may be placed in the area between the sidewalk and the curb line, but not in the street or public way. No Person shall shovel, plow or move snow out into the public way after it has been plowed, moved or removed. Furthermore, no objects or storm debris shall be placed into the street or public way unless authorized by the Town. Persons responsible for violation of this sub note shall be deemed guilty of a Category Level I A violation and subject to the penalty fees listed in the Town's Fee Schedule.
